In his liner shipping business for almost half a century, he has left in his trailing blaze, unparalleled contribution to the Maritime Industry not only in India, but globally, having secured and represented the top-notch largest liner shipping companies in the world, Maersk, Høegh, CGM, Nedlloyd, Lloyd Triestino, NOL/APL, Contship/CP Ships, to name a few. In the late 1990s and early 2000s he had the unique distinction of generating and handling almost 20% of India's total containerized traffic.

He was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by the erstwhile Mumbai and Nhava Sheva Ship-Intermodel Agents Association, now known as Maritime Association of Nationwide Shipping Agencies – India (MANSA) the prime Shipping Association of Shipping Agencies operating at Mumbai Port, Jawaharlal Nehru Port and Pan India, for his telling contribution to the shipping industry (private sector) in 2017. He was also the Trustee of Jawaharlal Nehru Port Trust. He had under his belt a string of awards from the Trade bodies, the govt. of India and Singapore bearing testimony to his immense contribution to the maritime and logistics sector.

11. Discussion on the Brainstorming session- MANSA the way ahead.

During the lengthy Deliberation by Capt. Ashok Rajput, Samsara Shipping, Capt. Sachin Kamble, Merchant Shipping. Sanjay Dalvi, the President, Mr. Vijayendra Paravataneni, Immediate Past President, Capt. Ram Iyer, Capt. P. P. Singh and Mr. Vijayan D'souza Past Presidents, K. Uthaya Kumar, Secretary General, it was agreed that MANSA will initiate a recall of the earlier email sent to MbPA.

It was pointed out and mutually agreed that despite the Berthing Policy 2020 mentioning the scope as including OCT berths, the policy itself and the order of priorities mentioned therein do not specifically mention OCT berths and how the berthing there are to be treated. It was mutually agreed that in view of 1. New Priorities being allocated to export steel vessels and 2. other shifting charges being levied by port to vessel occupying OCT and other berths, the entire berthing policy needs review.

It was mutually agreed that MANSA will send an email to MbPA seeking a meeting with its members asking for a review of the MbPA berthing policy 2020 which does not meet the changed scenario.

In order to preclude any further misgivings and concerns from any particular section of the agency members, it was suggested that such an email be first drafted and consent / views be taken from all members - prior to making the representation to MbPA.

MANSA's Activities

❖ **Significant Achievement to berth 3 Vessels Simultaneously at OCT berths:-**

Maritime Association of Nationwide Shipping Agencies – India (MANSA), with the persistent follow up with the Chairperson, Dy. Chairperson and their team of Traffic Manager, Dy. Conservator, Chief Engineer, Chief Mechanical Engineer, Mr. Subhrarabinda Birabar, Managing Director, ICTPL and his entire OCT Team, successfully berthed 3 vessels, MV GRAMPUS EVER - OCT 1, MV CHARIOTEER – OCT MIDDLE, MV KURUSHIMA – OCT 2 simultaneously at OCT berths for the first time ever. The operational team of Capt. R. Khavnekar, SDM, DM ID, OCT staff and the Mooring Crews coordinated and supported it commendably. It is a significant achievement and will contribute in good measure for the better turnaround and productivity of the vessels and facilitate optimum utilisation of the infrastructure and wase out congestion.

❖ **Committee for reviewing and formulation of Berthing Policy-reg:-**

During the meeting of MbPA and Maritime Association of Nationwide Shipping Agencies – India (MANSA) on 30.01.2025, for reviewing the Vessel related operational issues, the aspects of Berth allotment, Berthing priority, Shifting of vessels etc. during which it was pointed out that there are various circulars on Berthing of Vessels, etc and available in piece meal basis. Therefore, to simplify the policy and to ensure transparency, it was decided that a Committee consisting of members from MANSA, Marine Department, Traffic Department, and Finance Department be constituted for formulation of simple, explicit and transparent Berthing Policy, covering all the issues encountered during Vessel Berthing / Shifting / Unberthing, Priority Berthing issues, Cruise Vessel issues, OCT, etc. will be constituted.

❖ **Port Health Organisation:-**

By continuously taking up with Mr. Jagat Prakash Nadda, Minister of Health and Family welfare and Ms. Punya Salila Srivastava, Secretary, Letter dated 13-08-25, from Port Health Organization, Mumbai on Streamlining of PHO documentation process for Pratique and Health Clearance for Sail out under Initiative "One Nation: One Port Process" of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and waterways was elicited. This initiative aligns with the goal of enhancing Ease of Doing Business (EODB) and promoting digital integration at the ports. The streamlined documentation process, contribute to transparency, timely clearance, and transformational improvements.
